Judy Hughes' 2020 Delayed Retirement Celebration is Commemorated on a Perfect Day

"An 'invocation' is a prayer asking for God's presence to be among you and your guests. But if you look around us, you will see that He is already here"

He is already here." Father Steve's words were absolutely true as we celebrated the 2020 retirement of Judy Hughes, our HNES Head of School 2011-2020, Middle School principal 2007-2009, and Elementary Teacher 1991-1997. On numerous occasions, Covid had delayed any kind of ceremony, but the perfect day arrived on March 25, 2022. With family in attendance, Judy Hughes was loved on, praised, congratulated, thanked, applauded, and serenaded right

on the lawn at the school's front doors at "Judy's Circle" - a new fountain forever reminding our school of the dedication of Judy Elms Hughes.

Husband Bob Hughes said, I have watched Judy become a consummate educator, teacher and administrator, caring for the education of children in a loving yet very professional way. How many times has she been inname a store—and a young man or woman rushes up and says "Hello Mrs. Hughes, you were my favorite teacher. I decided to go to college because of your class, " or something similar. And she remembers them by name. I watched Judy, in the aftermath of Hurricane Michael, which all but destroyed HNES, immediately take charge, hiring the contractors, dealing with the insurers, assigning duties to staff and, at the same time, begin the planning of getting the children back in some semblance of school. 24/7 was not an overstatement about the time she spent during the Oct 2018-Aug 2019 period. She worked days, nights, weekends, burning up the laptop and the phone, and had the HNES children back in class (in the Episcopal

church) before the Bay District schools were back in session. I watched her work with the Board, with the teachers in planning how to teach under these circumstances, with the insurers, and then with the seemingly never-ending bouts with FEMA. She found portables and rented them and placed them behind Holy Nativity church, and the children finished the 2018-2019 school year. Then the buildings were ready for school in August of 2019 thanks to hers' - and others' - tireless work. Then came the virus. She went back to work 24/7 outlining the manner in which distant teaching would take place. The children's best interest was always paramount. Back to days and nights and weekends. During her tenure at HNES, I have watched her encourage and arrange professional development for the teachers, help in the selection of textbooks and if needed, curriculum planning. Her years as a teacher were of great importance in her performance as an excellent administrator. I have watched all this because I am her husband, and yes, if it sounds like I am very proud of her, I am very proud. I will stop short of saying that HNES would not

exist today in its current condition without Judy's experience and her tireless efforts in the face of sometimes unbelievable adversity. But it's close. I know she will miss the school, the teachers, the staff but most of all the children. She will miss the challenges which normally go with the job of Head of School, but probably will not miss the challenges that flow from hurricanes and viruses. There have been others in the life of HNES who have been instrumental in its fantastic success, but, from my perspective, Judy's contribution stands extremely tall in the school's life. Judy, enjoy retirement. Your accomplishments are lasting.

Son Robbie Hughes, added the significance of "Judy's Circle" - the idea that Judy would take something off another's plate, to handle herself.

Students in grade 1-4, circling Judy and her fountain, then sang the 1944 "I'll Be Seeing You" by Billie Holliday (and re-written here by Music Teacher Leigh Gladden):

I'll be seeing you In all the old familiar places That this heart of mine embraces All day through

In the lunch cafe
William's park across the way
The children's carousel
The magnolia tree
Your wishing well

I'll be seeing you
In every Wednesday chapel day
In everything that's light and gay
I'll always think of you that way
I'll find you in the morning sun
And when the night is new
I'll be looking at the school
But I'll be seeing you.

(at which point, all the students pointed directly to Mrs. Hughes).

A perfect day, indeed.

"In the waves of change, we find our true course."

The word "change" can scare a great many of us, but there is no doubt that this year brought about many changes. At the beginning of the school year, we thought COVID was done with us, but it had other plans and reared its ugly head. This school year alone, we navigated 197 cases of reported COVID: 17 faculty, 86 positive student cases, and 94 cases that opted into quarantine. As a school, finding ourselves in uncharted waters yet again, we adjusted our sails to this challenge. Our faculty worked tirelessly to make sure that our students felt loved and met their academic goals amid navigating an ongoing pandemic. If you haven't noticed by now, our faculty is undoubtedly capable of doing anything they are called upon to do! Over the past four vears, together we've successfully navigated our way through hurricanes, pandemics, political unrest, wildfires, accreditation visits, and now international war. Even in such changing times. Holy Nativity remains a center for academic excellence and a school that continues to instill God's love for one another. At the end of school year 2020-2021, we knocked our FCIS with zero mandates for the school! We've seen an overall rise in test scores across grade

2021, we knocked our FCIS accreditation visit out of the park with zero mandates for the school! We've seen an overall rise in test scores across grade levels, and our students are winning competitions at the county and state levels. I would even argue that we are garnering attention at the national level. One example would be our highly competitive Robo-Bolts! Not only did our students receive the top award from the FIRST LEGO League Robotics Regional Championship, they will now be

competing at the State Tournament, You will also find them at The First Lego League Razorback Invitational National Tournament in May in Arkansas! Way to go, Robo-Bolts! Why are we doing so well? It is because Holy Nativity has unbelievably dedicated teachers! Great teachers make a school, and we are blessed to have the cream of the crop here at Holy Nativity! Each one continues to work hard to make Holy Nativity what it is today while portraying God's love in every way. Also, change can make for great progress. This school year alone we were able to make great progress on many items. A major goal was accomplished on a comprehensive technology overhaul that included running fiberoptic cables to the pavilion and the houses. We now have the entire school on one managed wireless network. This significant addition also increased the reliability of the network for the entire campus. We were also fortunate to upgrade our fleet of Chromebooks so that the school is now officially a one-to -one campus. Hooray!!! We installed a state-of-the-art security system to keep our students and faculty safe in changing times. In the Bill Lloyd Building, we also made some major improvements to the building's foundation, refinished floors, updated the kitchen in McDaniel Hall, installed gutters, and replaced a large part of the building's pipes. Additionally, the Brian Sharp Memorial was rebuilt on our school campus! This replacement project was years in the making and I know it



meant so much to Brian's family. Many of these improvements were made possible by the dedication and generosity of many who love our school! Frequently, people will hear me make reference to how running a school is like being a Captain of a large ship. The waters are continuously changing and the Captain has to constantly reevaluate the navigational path while keeping her eyes on the horizon. Being flexible with change is sometimes challenging and there have been a lot of changes in a very short amount of time! Sometimes in life we can plan for changes, and other changes will just happen. No matter how rough the waters might get, there are always two stars in the sky that guide our ship: to love God and love your neighbor, the two rules of Holy Nativity.

Original 1990 Brian Sharp Memorial is Rebuilt on Holy Nativity Campus in 2022


Brian Austin Sharp (1984-1990) was a precious Holy Nativity kindergarten student who lost his life far too early in a tragic car accident.

The 1990 Sharp Memorial (pictured below) was built on the original school campus on the east end of the Holy Nativity Episcopal Church campus. It was thoroughly enjoyed by students of all ages. Even when HNES moved her entire student body to the Cove School grounds in 2009, the Church still made good use of this favorite outdoor space. That changed in 2018 when 150mph winds from Hurricane Michael toppled trees and loosened boards, devastating the classroom space. In the fall of 2021, Amy Moody led the planning for the brand new. and long-promised BSharp. Construction began in October by alumnus Carson Shores (HNES c/o 2013) of Shores Marine Construction. Fundraising requests were directed at our former HNES families and friends of Brian's. The project was 100% funded by its completion date! (See complete donor list on page 4.) On February 11, 2022, the Brian Austin Sharp Memorial Outdoor Classroom was unveiled on the south end of William's Field during a special ceremony in the Holy Pavilion.

In attendance were (pictured

above) Brian's Mom Tammy

Newton, and Brian's two brothers Adam Henely (HNES c/o 2010) & Eric Henely (HNES c/o 2005), and numerous other



thoughts, "Brian was a kind boy and I'm sure he would have grown into a wonderful man, rocking an incredible mane of hair! He was caring and giving and always so helpful. At the original HNES campus, there was this incredibly large

concrete tunnel on the lower elementary side which honestly never made sense considering there was a much smaller tunnel on the upper elementary side. Everyone loved to climb on the tunnel and sit on top, looking out across the playground. Brian was a master at this, unlike the other kindergarteners. I recall him always helping pull us up so we could get up there too. After he was gone, I never was able to get up there. It's the little things like this that always stand out. DJ shared, "The heartache of

losing a child at such a young age cannot be comprehended, but a light so bright will not be extinguished by grief. Rather it lives on in those he loved and in those who came after him. Holv Nativity emphasizes the importance of loving God and loving others. This school poured such love into Brian during his short life and the way that it continues to honor him and his memory today means more to his family than words can express. Brian would have loved this outdoor classroom and I know he will continue to smile down on this place."

Holy Nativity's Middle School Robotics team, the Robo-Bolts, has had a great season! Ten rookie members came on-board to replace last year's team of 8th graders. A new co-coach, Mrs. Audra **Resler**, also joined to help lead the team along with Mrs. Jan Dvkes and team mentor, Mr. Bryan Muller. With so many new team members, it was expected that the season would be full of learning and hard work. After all, the team needed to learn all about the various aspects of FIRST LEGO League. During FLL competitions, they must complete a timed obstacle course using a robot they built and coded. A separate part of the competition requires that the team create an innovative solution related to this year's theme-the transporting of cargo. The Robo-Bolts designed "The Truckstop of the Future" that better meets the needs of truck drivers and incorporates such novel ideas as using piezoelectric crystals to generate renewable energy.



They also have interviews with a panel of judges. A final part of the competition evaluates each team on how well they embody the core values of FIRST: Discovery, Innovation, Impact, Inclusion, Teamwork, and Fun. A bit more unexpected was just how successful this group of rookies would be! During the season, the Robo-Bolts have been recognized for robot design, robot performance, and core values. At the Northwest Florida Regional Tournament, the Robo-Bolts won the top award by earning the highest total number of points in all areas of the competition!

As the top performing team in the region, they also earned an invitation to compete at the state tournament in April and a chance to attend the FLL Razorback Open Invitational Tournament in May. This Invitational Event is hosted by the engineering department of the University of Arkansas. Eighty teams are invited to participate, with sixty to sixty-five of them being from North America and the remainder being from all over the world. What an incredible opportunity for our Holy Nativity Robo-Bolts! There are many adventures ahead for this amazing team! ~ Jan Dykes

Thank you for the beautiful ceremony and for the years of love. With love and gratitude. **Judy Hughes**




Graduation snapshots May 2021


THE COVE SCHOOLHOUSE IS 85

HISTORY OF COVE SCHOOL

Cove School opened in March of 1937. The block for the school was donated by H. L. Sudduth, of the Sudduth Realty Company. Besides the lot Mr. Sudduth donated the electric clock which is now located at the north end of the hall.

At first there were only five rooms. The five original teachers who brought their pupils from the Panama Grammar School were: Mrs. Bessie Rizell, Mrs. Clarke Dean, Mrs. Frank Holland, Miss Ruth Martin and the principal, Mr. Dozier. Miss Martin is the only one of the original teachers still teaching here.

G. H. Dozier was the first principal. His successor are: J. A. Headrich, Mrs. W. F. Harrison, assistant Mrs. Frank Holland, Mrs. Frank Holland and Mrs. O. L. Bridges.

The first year there was no playground equipment. We received the swing in 1938 from the County School Board.

In 1939 the first addition was made to the school. It consisted of two rooms. The second addition was made in 1941 which takes in the southern end of the building, beginning just below the library door.

2022 Holy Nativity Hero - Mr. Donnie McLawhon

Following our "Covid School year" of spring 2020, the 1944 Cove School had been switched to "off." There was no purpose having our historic bell "clanging" ten times a day when all students and faculty were at home guarantined. When students returned to campus in August 2020, we were all

surprised to find that the bell had "broken." It would ring when manually held, but it would not ring as before when the escapement gear hit the marking pins on the clock face. + In the fall of 2021, Business Manager Whitney Mims made a desperate Facebook plea searching for anyone who could help with this precious and historic timepiece. And Mr. Donnie McLawhon responded! What a blessing! Mr. McLawhon is not only a gifted *horologist* (watch & clock repairer), but he is an outstanding gentleman! He arrived at the school, diagnosed the problem in the clock fixtures, and then carried the entire system home to fully clean. When he returned, the bell was in its best condition in 24 vears! (Since Holy Nativity acquired Cove School in 1998.) While Mr. McLawhon did receive some awesome thank you notes from our students, he would not accept payment for his work. Mr. McLawhon, you are our hero!

My first memory of meeting Mary Sittman. must have been early in 1999. It was a beautiful, warm day. I had recently retired from parish ministry in Apalachicola, and Linda and I had moved home to Panama City. That day, I was high on a ladder that was leaning against the window frame of a window on the Hamilton Avenue face of my Alma Mater, the old Cove Elementary School building. Bill Lloyd was on the next ladder, and we were glazing windows, a

skill my father had taught me as a boy many long years earlier. If my memory serves me correctly, I was teaching Bill to glaze windows my way instead of his

way, although it Mary with June & Bill Lloyd in 2008 soon developed

into an amalgamation of his and mine, old and new. As we worked along together, developing what was to become one of my life's most cherished friendships, a car drove up, a mid-size gold or tan MB sedan, and Mary Sittman got out and came over to talk to Bill. As Bill climbed down from his ladder and introduced us, Mary looked at what I was doing and said, "I wish I could get up there and do that," and I reached out to hand her my window glazing tool.

The Holy Nativity School Foundation had recently acquired the Cove School

property. Mary's construction company was in charge of the contract for recovering the school building from decades of disuse and renovating it into a showplace for Holy Nativity Episcopal School, and Bill Lloyd, recently retired



foreman. Recently retired as parish priest, I was a volunteer Grandson Carter with Mary & Marvin worker on the project.

Over the years to come, working with Bill Lloyd on the building that years later, near the end of Bill's life, we christened The Bill Lloyd Building, and with Mary Sittman and her business partner and their workers. I acquired an awe of Mary in so many ways: her extraordinary intelligence, her keen business acumen, her impatience with nonsense and wasting time, her hospitality and kindness and warm friendship, her extravagant generosity. An accomplished and highly respected local builder and business innovator and entrepreneur, Mary was a driving force in recovering, finishing and offering to the local community, the Holy

Nativity School Foundation's former Cove School property that now includes the Bill Lloyd Building and the rest of the Holy Nativity Episcopal School campus at 205 Hamilton Avenue. Mary is always there when we need her. A member of the Holy Nativity School Foundation, she is always an enthusiastic supporter of the School, not only with her experience, knowledge, and skills, but also with her personal financial support. She is my very special friend, and a very, very special friend of our School.




