LYNN FERREN IS CELEBRATED ON HER 40TH ANNIVERSARY OF HOLY NATIVITY SERVICE



On a COLD Monday, November 14th in the Holy Pavilion, we celebrated LYNN FERREN DAY - the 40th anniversary of Mrs. Ferren's employment at HNES. Mrs. Ferren has served in many roles at HNES since 1982: preschool teacher, librarian, summer camp director, wildlife rehabilitation expert, book fair organizer, "stand-inchaplain," fundraiser volunteer and donor, safety drill coordinator, laminating facilitator, technology teacher, school photo manager, yearbook publisher, historian, purchasing clerk, official event photographer, and friend - just to name a few. :)

On LYNN FERREN DAY, our entire current student body was joined by numerous alumni, school friends, and even some of Mrs. Ferren's family members – brother Skip Carroll, son Jeff and his wife Aurora. Our celebration was named "\$40 and a Favor." The "\$40" represented the 40 years of Mrs. Ferren's service and the "favor" represented the service gifts that we offered. We encouraged all to consider a financial gift of \$40, a donation of a book, a donation of pet food, or an act of kindness. There were 142 books donated, 58 bags of pet

food contributed,

Our 8th graders all carried "Mrs. Ferren Big Head" and every student was happy to receive a "Lynn Ferren Iollipop" - a sucker with a sticker of Mrs. Ferren's face on the wrapper! The ceremony: Father Steve gave a special blessing; our

elementary students, directed by Leigh Gladden sang Josh Groban's "You Raise Me Up," guest speaker Beverly McDaniel (HNES Head Mistress 1988-2008) thanked Mrs. Ferren, Amy Moody & alumnus son Jake Moody prepared a slide show, and HNES Board of Trustee President William Cramer presented a very special honor – our Holy Nativity Library will forever be known as "The Lynn Ferren Library." Mrs. Ferren even received a replica "Lynn Ferren Library" plaque with signatures from all the 1st-8th grade students!

Lynn Marie Carroll Ferren was born in Evanston, Illinois, near Chicago – explaining her lifetime loyalty to the Cubs. Lynn is the oldest of three – two brothers Norman "Skip" Caroll and Jim (passed in 2021). Mrs. Ferren made Panama City home when her husband was named manager of the Army & Air Force Exchange Service at Tyndall Air Force Base. In 1982 Mrs. Ferren was asked to take over

going on maternity leave. Mrs. Ferren writes,



"When I started, the kids played and colored some pages while learning about being with friends. My co-teacher in 3K, Keiko Akamine and I worked on a program that I used in my former school in Ocean Springs, Mississippi. It was the Letter of the Week. We had so much fun finding all sorts of activities for each letter to cover everything including reading, math, science, and just plain fun."

Mrs. Ferren is definitely remembered for her animals! "Since I worked as a rehabilitation volunteer, I had baby birds. baby squirrels, and baby possums to foster. The babies had to be fed often, so I had them at school where we would take breaks for feedings. We also had lots of class pets. The one who lived the longest at school was Mr. T. the turtle. He loved cheese omelets and turtle racing around the kids. We also had rabbits, guinea pigs, hamsters, gerbils, fish, and rats. We did not have them all at one time! Twenty years in the classroom gives you plenty of time to have lots of different animal friends. At home, I have had four beloved doggies and two special Cockatiels, Patrick William and Sammy. 10-year old Shadow is my special fur baby now. His sister is Nola, Ms. Hope's dog." Mrs. Ferren's other job is at St. Patrick's Episcopal Church where she is the Senior Warden assisting Vicar Julia Phillips. Mrs. Ferren surmises: "The very best part of working at HNES is the fact that for all these years. I have worked every day at job that I love with people that I love. I

7th grader Catches WORLD RECORD 624-Pound Blue Marlin

It was an unforgettable trip for Elizabeth Arn. In late May of 2022, Elizabeth, her Dad Jonathan Arn, and a crew from Destin, set off on a memorable deep-sea fishing expedition. They traveled from Panama City Beach to Miami where they met up with their crew, then flew to Lisbon, Portugal, and finally to Cape Verde off the coast of Africa.

"We traveled to West Africa, Cape Verde specifically, to capture the Female *IGFA Junior Angler Record*," said Elizabeth's Dad, Jonathan. Randy Baker, of Destin, captained the 43-foot boat. Stephen Hall and Chase Travers served as first and second mate, and Capt. Scott Murie (also from Destin) manned the gaff, according to *The Destin Log*.

On May 31, Arn was using an extra-large horse ballyhoo as bait when she hooked the blue marlin herself. Using 80-pound test fishing line and sitting in a fighting chair, the 12-year-old got the fish to the boat in roughly 30 minutes. Captain Randy Baker said the crew donated the marlin meat after they weighed the fish back at the dock in Cape Verde.

The International Game Fish Association has confirmed the 624-pound Blue Marlin is a Junior World record - a category for anglers aged 11-16. According to *Outdoor Life*, the previous junior world record was held by Jordan McCullough, of Destin, who reeled in a 549-pound blue marlin off the coast of Ghana, Africa in 2003. The all-tackle world record blue marlin was 1,376 pounds and caught by Jay de Beaubien on May 31, 1982 off Kaaiwi Point, Kona, Hawaii.

On March 24th, 2023, 6th grade scholar-athlete **Bi-Neh Awantang** became one of the youngest players to win a BAY COUNTY high school tennis championship when she claimed the title at the age of 12 years, 3 months.
Playing for Rutherford School, Bi-Neh won the 2nd seed, Girls' Singles Title by beating the North Bay Haven 2nd seed, 6-2, 6-0. She and partner **Mbongta Awantang** (her

sister and HNES alumna) also claimed the Bay County 1st seed Girls' Doubles' Title! In April, Bi-Neh added DISTRICT 2-A Singles & Doubles Championships to her resume. Concluding her first year of high school tennis, Bi-Neh heads to State Competition on April 24th with a 2023 high school record of 11-1 singles, 10-2 doubles.

As of April, Bi-Neh's Rankings in Age12 Girls are impressive: Nationally ranked #268, State ranked #33, Region ranked #1. Bi-Neh also serves as SGA Treasurer and maintains a 4.0 GPA. She takes pride in being a leader and a good student. Holy Nativity middle school students tryout and participate on sports teams at Bay County public and charter schools.

6th grader **Hannah Kline** has had another record-breaking year for Edgewater Gymnastics. This 2023 season, she has seven 1st place *All Around* titles, (not including state). In addition to winning 1st place at every meet this season in her age group, she also took home 1st place of all ages combined as Grand Champion. She has 11 scores in "America's Top 100" throughout her career & is currently ranked #3 & #4 in the country on floor with her most recent 9.925 & 9.9



floor scores. She has 23 total 1st place *All Around* titles in her career. This is her 4th year in a row to be named Team Captain & last year at the Edgewater banquet, was awarded "Hardest Worker." It surprises no one that Hannah is also a straight-A student and continues to make academics a priority in her busy schedule.

Robo-Bolts Continue to Shine ~ by Coach Jan Dykes

to build on the strong foundation built by our first robotics team during the 2020-2021 school year. Last year's successful season culminated with them winning the Regional Championship and going on to represent the Northwest Florida region at the State Tournament. They also received an invitation to attend the prestigious Razorback Open Invitational at the University of Arkansas. Eighty top teams from around the world compete at this event. "It was a lot of fun. We got to meet teams from around the world and learn more about Fayetteville. Seeing all of the amazing robots and innovation projects from the different teams was a great experience," recalls Robo-Bolts team member Anna McCord. Making this trip required the support of many sponsors. The St. Joe Community Foundation, Naval Surface Warfare Center-Panama City, Keeton Corrections, Anchor CEI, Proper Fox Consulting, E. F. San Juan, Society for American Military Engineers (SAM-E), Bryan Muller, Judy Hughes, the Ben Lee Family, the Max McCord Family, Dr. Sam & Dr. Laurie Wolf. Doolittle Institute/Defensewerx. and several anonymous donors helped the team take part in this phenomenal event. We are so grateful! As we left the 2022 competition in Arkansas, several commented that this was a "once in a lifetime experience." That statement seemed more likely as we headed to our Regional Championship this year. After winning the top award at our initial tournament, we would be competing with the top 18 teams in Northwest Florida, and six of our team members were unable to attend as they were on a school field trip to New York. With only three of our nine team members competing, success seemed unlikely. The Robo-Bolts participate in FIRST LEGO League (FLL). FIRST was founded in 1992 to inspire young students to follow technical career paths. To participate in FLL, teams must undertake a number of tasks. They build a robot using LEGO parts and use a Scratch-based coding language to program the robot so that it will complete a series of missions in a

timed obstacle course challenge. A separate part of the competition requires that the team create an innovative solution related to this vear's theme-energy. The Robo-Bolts designed "The Bolt Buoy." This is a buoy designed for near-shore deployment that can act as a charging station for electric boats and electrical boat components. We hope to increase the use of renewable resources in coastal areas, reducing pollution. The team members have to present their robot design and their innovation project to a panel of judges and answer questions. These judges are STEM professionals, and, let me tell you, they have some great (and challenging) questions! A final part of the competition evaluates each team on how well the team embodies the core values of FIRST: Discovery, Innovation, Impact, Inclusion, Teamwork, and Fun. As you can see,

this competition is multifaceted and demanding for a full team of middle schoolers-and certainly for a team of three. However, this dedicated team was determined to shine! The Robo-Bolts finished the **Regional Competition** with the top award for Robot Design and were second overall, earning a bid to

compete in an International Invitational once again! We are headed back to the University of Arkansas for the Razorback Open Invitational again! Indeed, lightning has struck twice for this amazing team! A number of generous supporters have already stepped up to help with our second trip to Arkansas. Baseball Returns to Sudduth Park

The post-Hurricane Michael repairs to Sudduth Park are complete and Cove families are back like never before! Located at 1500 E. 2nd Court in The Cove neighborhood, the park received \$1.3 million from insurance and FEMA, to restore and improve its grounds. "The Panama City News Herald" reported that the "improvements include a new baseball field, new dugouts, a refurbished concession stand, new utilities, a drainage system, new parking areas, a pavilion, picnic tables and park benches. In addition, the park will receive new playground equipment and an electronic scoreboard, which are expected to be delivered and installed in 2023." Sudduth Park is named for Homer L. Sudduth the real estate developer

who, in 1953, gave property to the City for the development of a community park. (In 1936. Mr. Sudduth donated the land for the Cove Schoolhouse - "Located on Hamilton" Avenue, between Pine and Olive streets, the Cove school building will accommodate pupils of the elementary grades living in the rapidly growing Cove section. The city block on which the school is located, was a donation by H.L. Sudduth, who has been a recognized factor in securing necessary materials to aid in matching the Federal grants in the construction, said the superintendent., A. L. Hardy. "The Panama City Herald," March 6, 1937)

Sudduth Seminoles Coach Chris Cramer (an HNES alumnus and current HNES Dad) told the media that playing on the Sudduth

Park field as a kid is one of his favorite memories and he is overjoyed that his sons now have the same opportunity. 7th grader Parker Rowe stands in the school hallway with a photo of Mrs. Lanelle Rowe's 1951-1952 Cove Grammar School 2nd grade class. Mrs. Rowe, now 96-years old, is Parker's great-grandmother! This treasured photo is now on permanent display in the Cove School history cabinet in the Bill Lloyd Building.
